Brian Smith has contacted us with news of the Proposed new **Wirksworth U3A** group and we thought some of you would be interested to hear about this:

LEARN, HAVE FUN AND MAKE NEW FRIENDS

When you reach the third age, the youngsters have moved out, and you are no longer in fulltime work; then is the time you may want to make new friends and grasp the opportunity to do the things you have been putting off for many years.

This is where the University of the Third Age comes in, offering no degrees, requiring no assignments to be completed by a deadline. The U3A is a nation-wide organisation of more than 400,000 people who share their expertise and learn from each other, having fun on the way.

With Matlock and Bakewell U3As being so successful, it has been mooted that a new U3A group be set up in Wirksworth to give opportunity for many to have a group that is more local to them, and which can cater specifically for their needs.

If you want to go walking or learn a language; if you would like to visit theatres in the company of others, discuss a book you have read, or socialise over dinner, then U3A is for you. Each U3A is autonomous, but receives advice and support from the Third Age Trust, based in south London. Typically a U3A will have at least twenty interest and activity groups reflecting the interests of the members.
