DES ARTISTES DIOIS AU FESTIVAL D'ART DE WIRKSWORTH



Quatre Diois ont franchi la Manche ce mois de septembre pour se rendre au Festival de Wirksworth, notre ville jumelle anglaise.

Ce Festival annuel d'Art et d'Architecture rassemble plus de 150 artistes du Derbyshire et le programme était cette année réparti du 7 au 23 septembre entre performances artistiques, arts plastiques, musique, théâtre, chorégraphie et cinéma... alliant aussi les associations locales, les écoles, les collèges et lycées.

En partenariat avec Diois Jumelage

ce festival avait sélectionné des artistes Diois et mis à leur disposition un lieu d'exposition, le Moot Hall (ancien tribunal des mines de plomb) au centre de la ville pendant le week-end du 8 au 9 Septembre. Les préparatifs ont été longs et le trajet éprouvant pour parcourir les quelque quatorze cents kilomètres et la Manche qui séparent les deux villes avec deux voitures chargées pour les uns de sculptures, peintures, dessins et pour les autres d'objets d'art manufacturés en bois. Les protagonistes étaient, dans la

première voiture, Annie Guéron de Luc-en-Diois et Guy Nicod de Châtillon-en-Diois, qui ont décidé de faire le trajet par le centre de la France avec la traversée de Manche en Ferry de nuit : Cherbourg - Poole. Dans la seconde voiture Laurence et Jean-Paul Empi, tourneurs sur bois rue de l'Armellerie à Die, ont fait le trajet en deux jours par Calais.

Mais bravo à nos amis anglais du Jumelage et au comité d'organisation du Festival qui ont réussi à estomper toute notre fatigue par leur accueil chaleureux et l'ambiance festive qui régna pendant tout notre séjour.

Malgré la fatigue, le soir on se retrouvait au pub pour faire ou écouter de la musique et boire une de leurs nombreuses bières tièdes dont seuls les Britanniques ont le secret. Une expérience et des souvenirs impérissables qui font perdurer la fraternité et l'amitié entre les peuples malgré tous les événements et tous les brexit réunis.

Au retour, les 839 miles qui nous séparaient de Die ont été un jeu d'enfants. Enfin... presque!

Depuis maintenant trois ans, le Comité Diois-Jumelages est partenaire du festival des Arts et la Vigne et présente ainsi des artistes des villes jumelles. Une belle idée!


Further links we hope to develop and future plans
